Matters arising from previous meeting

Follow up with Cllr Louise regarding contact details of Developers submitting Planning application for mobile mast at Football Club for JM - Following a conversation with Cllr Louise JM had been advised CCBC not actively seeking for Mobile mast installations but any Planning applications from developers will be given consideration

JM requested that businesses need to flag up Senedd Members/MP etc and head sent a letter to Janet Finch Saunders who had responded see attached letter but also had a meeting with her 2/8/2024

Multi-Storey signage poor but CCBC do not advertise as privately owned – JM will continue to lobby Cllr Nigel Smith – c/fwd

Footfall Statistics

Footfall Statistics for June 2024 to June 2023 show them down 31K – Query as to whether this is a glitch as some attendees indicated they were quieter than normal but some said they were busier.

Could the mobile signal issues be affecting these stats

CCBC undertaking work on the Evening economy – a reminder was provided that the survey was closing 21/7 and that if not completed already that they be encouraged to complete

CCBC has released that they are looking to relocate the Library and Tourism Information Centre in town to Venue Cymru as part of their UK Funding award of £10Million to create a Cultural Hub. This was agreed under Levelling Up through previous Government.

EH commented that 100K footfall to Library and 85K to TIC annually.

CCBC have to undertake Consultation over the Library but not the TIC as not an essential service

Cambrian Rally back in October

CCBC – Supporting Local Business Key Fund – Town Centre Grant

HT provided details of the above scheme which will close to applications September 2024 or at such time as the funds have been fully committed, if earlier.

To be eligible to receive investment support, businesses must be located in the County of Conwy, have been actively trading over 6 months and registered with HMRC.

The scheme offers funding of up to 80% on eligible capital expenditure for projects with awards offered from £3,000 up to £15,000.

Eligible works

Projects including (but not limited to):

- Shopfronts including cosmetic and minor structural improvements
- Improved display windows
- Signage
- Windows and doors
- External lighting
- Rainwater goods
- Rendering, stone cleaning and re pointing

Alice Trail – Refurbishment of Statues

Tender had gone out twice in relation to the works to the above - No submission received

Looking at a direct award to a local company – currently working through costings. Aim for works to be complete by December 2024.

Shelters/Colonnades
